Getting to the Theatre



The Everyman is located in the centre of Cork city, within walking distance of both bus and train stations.

The address and postcode are:

15 MacCurtain Street, Victorian Quarter, Cork, T23 E094

Get here by walking

Coming from St Patrick Street, cross St Patrick's Bridge, continue up Bridge Street and turn right onto MacCurtain Street. The Everyman is halfway down MacCurtain Street, on the right-hand side and near The Metropole Hotel.

Get here by bus

Buses 207 and 208 stop at MacCurtain Street. Most bus routes depart from St Patrick Street, a five-minute walk away.

Get here by train

Kent train station is a five-minute walk to The Everyman. Coming out of the train station, turn left on Lower Glanmire Road, continue on straight to MacCurtain Street, where The Everyman can be found halfway along the street on the left-hand side.

Car parking

Q-Park, Carroll's Quay is a short walk to The Everyman. When coming to The Everyman, pre-book your parking on [Q-Park.ie](https://www.q-park.ie) and get safe and easy parking in Q-Park, Carroll's Quay. The Everyman patrons will get 25% off parking using code **EMAN25**.

When You Arrive

The entrance to The Everyman is on 15 MacCurtain Street.



The Everyman

The theatre's Box Office is on the left when you enter The Everyman.



Lights

The Everyman is lit by electric lights. The inside areas are well lit but not too bright.

The Everyman Bar

The Everyman bar is on your right as you walk along the foyer past the Box Office. You can buy a drink at the bar and you are welcome to sit and relax before the performance begins. There is normally music played in the bar. The bar will not be open during the performance. But it will be open for service again as soon as the performance is over.



Toilets

There are men's, women's and wheelchair accessible toilets located near the bar.

There are two ways you can get to the toilets, through a door from the bar or from the main corridor.

- The female toilets have two cubicles. There are sinks and a hand dryer.
- The male toilets have one cubicle and two urinals. There are two sinks and a hand dryer.
- The wheelchair accessible toilet is a room with one toilet, a sink and a hand dryer.

The toilets can be used throughout the performance.



The Everyman Shop

There is a small shop next to the auditorium door where you can purchase refreshments and confectionery before the show begins. The shop will close as soon as the performance starts.

The Everyman Auditorium

The Everyman auditorium has 350 seats downstairs. It also has an upstairs balcony.

All seats look the same. Each row has a letter of the alphabet at the beginning. Each seat has a number underneath it. Your seat row and number will be written on your tickets. It may be hard to find your seat, but you can ask a member of staff if you need help.



The ceiling is quite high and patterned in blue and gold. On either side of the stage there are very ornate boxes with red curtains.



The Balcony

The balcony is the upstairs seating area of The Everyman, there are 300 seats. The staircase to the right of the shop brings you to the balcony level. There are 46 steps. The entrance to the balcony is at the top of the stairs to your left.



Upstairs Toilets

There are men's and women's toilets located just outside the balcony.

- The female toilets have three cubicles. There are two sinks and a hand dryer.
- The male toilets have one cubicle and three urinals. There are two sinks and a hand dryer.

The toilets can be used throughout the performance.



Staff

The Everyman staff will make your visit as pleasant as possible.

Box Office Staff

You will recognise the **Box Office staff** as they will be sitting behind the Box Office window. You can purchase and/or collect your ticket from the Box Office.

Front of House Staff

The **Everyman Front of House Manager's** role is to make sure your visit is pleasant. You will recognise the Front of House Manager as he or she will be wearing a lanyard with a name badge as pictured below left.



Ushers

You will recognise the ushers as they will be standing in the foyer and by the auditorium door and will ask to see your ticket. They will be wearing a lanyard with a name badge as pictured above right. They will also show you to your seat if you cannot find it easily.

About the Show

There are seven main characters played by actors in the Panto:

Red Riding Hood (played by two different actresses), Granny Peggy Twomey, Deco the Wolf, Pip, Pana the Poodle, Jack the Woodcutter and Boo-Boo the Imaginary Friend. There are also dancers and a children's chorus.

This is a Panto performance for **everyone**.

If you need to leave the theatre during the show, that's okay. And if you'd like to come back in again, that's fine too.

If you need to make noise or move around during the performance, that is okay.

You can call out to actors on stage sometimes too:

- Oh, Yes it IS – Oh, No it's NOT!
- She's BEHIND you!
- There's a chance to join in the singing and dancing too, later in the show, if you'd like.

If the person beside you is making noise or moving during the performance, please don't feel like you need to shush them.

If you have a mobile phone, please don't have the volume on or use the phone during the performance unless you really need to.

The show will last about 90 minutes in total. There may be an interval. There are some loud noises during the performance. If you are sensitive to loud noises, please feel free to wear your ear defenders during that part.
